Phases and Gating Criteria



Phases

PHASE 1

Risk of spreading of COVID-19 is significant. Requires Significant Mitigation.

Remote Learning

All schools are closed.

PHASE 2

Risk of spreading COVID-19 is moderate but increasing. Requires Moderate Mitigation.

Hybrid Learning

Reduced days on campus at all schools.

PHASE 3

Risk of spreading COVID-19 is minimal. Requires Minimal Mitigation.

No risk of community transmission of COVID-19.
Requires little to no Mitigation.

School Specific


Schools are open, some campuses hybrid or remote learning. **On Campus**

Gating Criteria


- HCS will communicate Phase and Transition status based on public health data.
- The key criterion is the number of active cases as a % of total residents in Hamilton County.
 - Hamilton County Health Department defines "active cases" and publicly reports this data daily.
- HCS will notify families and staff if there is a change in status.
- Operational details for each phase are contained in HCS Reentry & Continuous Learning Plan.

Best Practices





Please take the **Hamilton County Schools Pledge** and commit to the following healthy behaviors:

Stay at home if you are sick!







Avoid getting too close to others.

Maintain social distance from other people. Students should keep their belongings separated. Sharing books, pencils, and devices is discouraged. If sharing supplies is necessary, disinfect them between uses.





Face coverings are a must.

Face coverings can help cut down on the spread of COVID-19 by people that have no or mild symptoms and that might be spreading the virus unknowingly. Continue to keep space between yourself and others.





Everyone wash your hands and sanitize surfaces.

Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds especially after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing. If soap and water are not available, use a hand sanitizer. Regularly disinfect frequently touched surfaces.





Face Coverings

- Phase 2 and 3: Schools are on a reduced schedule or open with short term closures in some buildings. Risk of spreading COVID-19 is minimal to moderate.
 - All students and staff are required to wear a face mask. Accommodations as needed for students with special needs and other medically necessary reasons.
 - It is recommended but not required that K-2 students wear masks in the classroom, as long as they are in a cohort with the same group of students.
 - Masks are always required when in the building outside the classroom for all students and staff, even for K-2 students.
 - Each school will provide safe space and time during the school day for students to remove masks.
- Hamilton County government has issued a face mask requirement for all public spaces effective Friday, July 10.









OPTION 2: HCSatHome Program

All HCS families have the option to choose our HCSatHome remote learning program with their base school for the full semester, regardless of what phase the district is in for face-to-face instruction. Families must register ahead of each semester for the 2020-2021 school year.

OPTION 3: Hamilton County Virtual School

This program requires enrolling at Hamilton County Virtual School as your child's base school. The programming is self-directed and self-paced, with more reliance on families for curriculum support and engagement. This school supports students in grades K-12.



Option 2, HCS at Home

Students attending the HCS at Home program:

- Will be connected to their zoned or magnet school while learning remotely from their home environment.
- Students will work with teachers in all content areas and learn the same content at the same pace as their peers who attend in-person classes.
- Attendance will be taken each day. Students will follow the daily arrival and dismissal times of their enrolled school.

Option 2, HCS at Home: Assessment

INITIAL ASSESSMENT

- A guardian may submit an initial Child Find evaluation request in writing to the student's zone school principal.
- Assessment specialists will schedule testing sessions to occur at the student's zone school.
- Questions regarding the initial Child Find evaluation process should be submitted to Kathy Petros, Supervisor of Assessment, at petros_kathy@hcde.org.

TRIENNIAL REEVALUATION

- Eligible students who are due for a triennial reevaluation will be monitored by their Ex Ed case manager.
- Case managers will facilitate the scheduling of an IEP Team meeting so that the team can review the student's Reevaluation Summary Report and eligibility outcomes can be determined.
- For reevaluation outcomes that require face-to-face components, assessment specialists will schedule testing sessions to occur at the student's zone school.



Continued Information

- We will be providing each teacher with a "PPE kit" and every school with a "COVID-19 supply kit" (cleaners, barriers/dividers, dispensers, etc.)
- We will provide masks for students that do not have them.
- August 12-14 will be orientation focused for families.
- Wednesday, July 8 Wednesday, July 22: Sign-up for remote learning options.
 - Form via Parent Portal and new student registration.
 - Previously registered students sign-up via email.
